## Greenway Rules

- Enjoy and respect the Greenway.
- The Greenway is a Fee Use area; payment is required on arrival at the Greenway.
- All Federal, State, and Local laws are enforced within the Greenway.
- Obey all directions given by Rangers, Greenway staff, or posted signs.
- Failure to comply with these rules may result in a summons or an arrest.
- Equestrian trails may be closed following a rain event. Call Greenway HQ for updated trail information at 803.547.1019.

## PRINCIPLE RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- Trails open daily at 7am and close at sunset.
- All bikes must access Greenway from Trailhead at Leroy Springs Recreation Complex Access on Hwy 160. Cyclists must use bike trails only.
- All equestrians must access Greenway from Trailhead at the Nature Center Access on US 21 Bypass. Use designated horse trailer parking. Equestrians must use horse trails only.
- Hikers may use all trails.
- Bikes yield to hikers; hikers yield to horses.
- If you pack it in, pack it out. Trash and recycle containers are located at major trailheads. Glass containers are not allowed.
- Dogs must be leashed. Dogs are not allowed in Greenway lakes or streams.
- Do not harm wildlife or the Greenway landscape. This applies to you and your animals.
- Do not scratch, injure, or deface trees.
- Do not pick flowers, cut branches, remove plants, or dig in Greenway soil.
- Amplified sound devices are not allowed without a permit.
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited on trail system.
- Hunting and possession of firearms is prohibited.
- Open fires are restricted to campsite fire rings and subject to local fire bans.
- Swimming is prohibited in lakes and streams.
- Fishing is restricted to members only. SC DNR fishing license required.
- Except under permit by the Greenway Director, alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
- A permit is required for any commercial activity including commercial photography; distribution or selling of goods, food, or drink; holding an event, picnic, or party with more than 20 persons. Events requiring separate paid admission or registration must be approved by the Greenway director.
- In case of emergency, dial 911.
